LongHouse Reserve Tours for 2012

As a result of word-of-mouth and increased media exposure over the years, LongHouse Reserve has become a popular destination for museums, garden clubs, libraries, destination tours, and community groups who enjoy the natural beauty of spectacular garden displays blended with outdoor sculpture.

Located in beautiful East Hampton, New York, LongHouse Reserve is a sixteen acre garden with established lawns, ornamental borders, plant collections and outdoor sculpture, planned by the internationally recognized textile designer, Jack Lenor Larsen. Mr. Larsen, along with the recommendations of the LHR Art Committee, has assembled a collection of over 70 sculptures for the gardens.

Situated in the garden are ceramics and bronzes by Toshiko Takaezu and bronzes by Costantino Nivola and Augustus St. Gaudens. Other well known sculptures include *Blue Cobalt Spears*, by Dale Chihuly; *The Fly's Eye Dome*, designed by Buckminster Fuller; *Play it By Trust*, by Yoko Ono, *Reclining Figure* by Willem de Kooning, *Irregular Progression* by Sol LeWitt, and a gravity defying kinetic sculpture by Takashi Soga.

Enjoy our water feature – a 20x20' reflecting pool with a 15' geyser shooting up from the center – as well as our new installations: *Rabdomante* by Magdalena Abakanowicz, two black standing figures overlooking Peter's Pond; and *Tumbling Woman* by Eric Fischl.

It is difficult to say what is most spectacular in the gardens - be it the many fabulous sculptures, the Dry River with numerous small plantings and stone bridges, the stunning display of a million daffodil blossoms in April/May, or the "red garden" abloom in mid-May, when an extraordinary display of red azaleas and red maples highlight a "trompe l'oeil" display of red posts that narrow to Toshiko Takeazu's superbly crafted ceramic vessel. Spring, summer or fall, the gardens are always a delight to explore.

Terms and Conditions of LongHouse Reserve Tours

- ❑ Tour consists of a docent guided tour of the grounds and parts of the house and takes approximately 1-1/2 to 2 hours.
- ❑ Following the tour - *not before* - the group may stroll the grounds (*not the house*) on their own.
- ❑ A box lunch from a local caterer may be arranged and takes place *after* the tour is completed. Up to 30 people can be accommodated.
- ❑ The tour operator is responsible for arranging the lunch, see next page for suggested caterers.
- ❑ Removal of trash from lunch is responsibility of tour operator – *cannot be left at LongHouse.*
- ❑ Tour availability is Monday through Friday – scheduled anytime from 9 am to 3 pm (tour must end no later than 5 pm).
- ❑ The fee for the tour is \$20/person, or a minimum of \$300 per group, *whichever is greater*. **A \$200 non-refundable deposit is required upon booking.**
- ❑ If requested and depending on his schedule, Mr. Larsen will give the tour. There will be an additional fee of \$250 per group, *which is payable along with the non-refundable deposit.*
- ❑ The tour date is not confirmed until receipt of deposit.
- ❑ Comfortable walking shoes recommended.
